Social and Emotional Well-Being is achieved at KPS through the implementation of a variety of programs including PATHS, Protective Behaviours, Zones of Regulation, the Chaplaincy service, Peer Mediation and many others. These school wide programs enable us to encourage a collective effort to optimise the social, emotional, physical and academic outcomes of all of our students.

Our school strives to foster respect and sensitivity in providing a challenging and inclusive learning environment. Teachers are supported in negotiating learning outcomes and plans regularly, building on individual and group needs and strengths. Our approach to inclusivity at KPS extends beyond our students to encompass our teachers and community. Pastoral care is of extreme importance at Kinross PS.

Additionally, we place emphasis on developing the physical child. This area of learning relates to the development of children's body control and coordination of large movements, fine manipulative skills, spatial awareness and balance. It also focuses on children's knowledge and understanding of a healthy lifestyle upon which physical well-being depends.

Physical skills, body and spatial awareness contribute to a child's personal and social development by enhancing confidence and self-esteem. Young children are active learners who enjoy learning through play and physical activities. During play children engage in learning experiences that require them to use a range of physical skills whether playing indoors or outdoors. Physical activities can be incorporated into every area of learning, from simple action rhymes and games in Mathematical Development to large movements in response to creative music. At Kinross PS we have embraced whole school strategies to promote Health and Fitness through the establishment of Jogging Club, Jump Jam Club, Breakfast Club, dance performances, Fitness sessions, Brain Breaks, Loose Parts Hubs, Makerspace Clubs and the construction of nature playgrounds
