

The teams were given the brief that their buildings had to be cross braced, contain specific shapes within the bracing construction and withstand earth shaking. # Waste Wise at KPS





Congratulations to TA1, Miss John's Year 1 class, for winning our first Waste Wise competition for this term. TA1 collected the most used batteries for recycling: nearly 200 batteries!

Our challenge for the remaining weeks of term two is for classes to collect plastic bread tags. As plastic bread tags are made from hard plastic, they are unable to be put into our yellow lid recycling bins. At the end of this term we will send the collected bread tags to a special recycling centre in South Australia. Here the bread tags will be turned into useful items such as seedling containers and picture frames. The money raised from the sale of these items is used to purchase wheelchairs. At the end of this term we will see which class has collected the most bread tags in their mini bins!



We require a donation of two large plastic rubbish bins with lids to hold hay. The hay helps us to make compost which feeds our vegetable gardens. If you have a clean bin that you no longer use, please let Mrs Davies or the office know.



#### Waste Free Wednesdays

Don't forget to bring a waste free lunch to school on Wednesday, or every day if you can! # Fundraising Update – our goals for 2019

You may remember back at our AGM in February we committed \$10,000 towards upgrading the current air conditioning in the library to reverse cycle. A much needed improvement which will benefit all of our children.

Disappointingly we were a little off target with our estimates and with quotes coming in around \$22,000 we had to put this to one side whilst we fundraised to meet the shortfall.

We don't like giving up and so approached a company who specializes in projects such as ours and we are delighted to announce the air-conditioning upgrade will be going ahead during the school holidays and ended up costing \$12,500 in total. We extend our thanks to AHI Carrier and Toshiba Air Conditioning for their support with this project!

This term we are also pleased to offer our support towards the purchase of some hand held walkie talkies which will be used by duty staff on the oval and other events during the year. We feel these are a valuable piece of equipment and a worthwhile investment for our school.

We are also pleased to support the schools literacy program with the much needed purchase of 1000 scholastics home readers for the junior years. The companies have generously included some education packs for our senior years for free. We hope to see these books at school very soon!

Throughout the year we approach the teaching staff to see if they need or want anything for their classrooms. If you feel there are resources or areas within the school that the P&C could contribute to then please let us know!

### Pizza Day


Pizza day was a great success! Thank you to all children who ordered and enjoyed their pizza last Monday (and Tuesday)
