


## Kinross Busy Bee

## Kinross School Review

Kinross PS will be having our School Review early next year on February 11<sup>th</sup>. The reviewers will meet with students, staff, P&C, School Board and external agencies. The leadership team has been very busy preparing for this review and are looking forward to showcasing our wonderful school.


