## Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework

The Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework is identified as a priority in the Department's Strategic Plan for WA Public Schools.

The framework supports all Department of Education staff to reflect on their approaches to the education of Aboriginal students. It sets expected standards for all staff when working with Aboriginal students, their families and communities.

The framework supports staff to reflect on their behaviours, attitudes and practices and identify opportunities for improved action. The framework is aligned with the Australian Professional Standard for Principals and Australian Professional Standards for Teachers.

Following a period of familiarisation with the Framework in 2016, from 2017 all schools are expected to use self-assessment against the framework in school improvement planning. This practice should form part of schools' ongoing improvement planning.

In our multicultural society, it is vital for schools to welcome and be responsive to all cultures, and our focus in the Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework is Aboriginal students. At Kinross PS, we promote the Australian values of Understanding, Tolerance and Inclusion. Students are taught to be aware of others and their cultures, accept diversity within a democratic society, be included and include others. Racism and Discrimination have no place at our school.


## Fortnight of STEAM

#### Influenza and General Sickness

There have been several confirmed cases of influenza at school this term as well as a multitude of other illnesses that come when the cold weather strikes. We urge you to be aware of the signs and symptoms of influenza (below) and to seek medical attention as soon as possible. We also encourage you notify the office of any diagnosed illnesses as soon as possible, and to keep your children at home if they are unwell. This helps keep not only our students healthy, but our staff as well.

Influenza					
A common, acute, respiratory, viral infection. Symptoms include fever, malaise, chills, headache, muscle pain, sore throat and cough.					
Transmission	Airborne or droplet				
Incubation period	Usually 1 – 4 days				

Infectious period	Usually 1 day before onset of symptoms until 7 days after
Exclusion	Exclude until symptoms resolved
Treatment	Varies according to symptoms. Antiviral treatment available as recommended by doctor

My favourite was the Apricot flavour! During the week we also had incursions presented by Nearer to Nature to teach the children about Australia's natural resources. ## Canteen News


Look out for some exciting changes coming to the canteen in term 3 and beyond!
