It is important as a community we teach our children how to react when faced with conflicts or difficult situations. The Zones of Regulation is taught to every student across the school and reviewed every year.

At Kinross PS, our attendance rate is above the WA and like school average. Kinross parents make it a priority to ensure their child attends school unless sick. Attendance is a big factor that affects a child's learning and performance at school.

#### Attendance Requirements

As a parent, you are required by the School Education Act 1999 to ensure your child attends school every day that the school is open for instruction (Section 23). Principals are

responsible for monitoring and accurately recording the attendance of every student enrolled at their school in accordance with Section 28 of the School Education Act 1999. If a student is absent, a responsible person, usually the parent, must notify the school of the reason for the student's absence as soon as practical. If a student is prevented from attending school due to illness, the principal is authorised by the School Education Act 1999 to request a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner. All students who are absent for more than two days require a medical certificate. Lesson attendance codes are used by all Western Australian public schools to record the reason for every half-day absence. The use of these codes is determined by the principal. Accurate record-keeping ensures principals can identify patterns of absence at both a school and individual student level and implement appropriate measures to restore attendance where there is cause for concern.

Absences are grouped as either 'authorised' or 'unauthorised' according to whether they meet the requirements of excusing a student from attendance pursuant to Section 25 of the School Education Act 1999. The total half-day absences are displayed on your child's school report each semester.

#### Restoring Attendance

When a student's absences are identified as a concern, schools will work collaboratively with students and parents to develop and implement strategies for improved attendance.

This will usually include the principal, teacher or other relevant staff meeting with the student and parents to:

- Investigate the reasons for the absences
- Identify issues concerning the absences
- Develop strategies to improve attendance.

Several meetings or phone calls may be required in order to review and amend strategies to restore attendance. A principal may seek to draw on the advice and expertise of external services, agencies or community members to assist in developing strategies, or to facilitate additional support for the student or their parents. In some cases, the principal may offer parents an Attendance Advisory Panel or a Responsible Parenting Agreement.

#### Effects of Absences on Learning

Attendance matters for achievement, and every day counts. The nature of the relationship between absence from school and achievement, across all sub-groups of students strongly suggests that every day of attendance in school contributes towards a child's learning, and that academic outcomes are enhanced by maximising attendance in school. There is no "safe" threshold. The effects of absence also accumulate over time. We found that absence from school was related to academic achievement in numeracy, reading and writing not only in the current year, but in future years as well. Parents need to be aware of these relationships, and understand that when their child misses school it can have an ongoing impact on their learning

I encourage parents to use school holidays wherever possible when booking family vacations. This guarantees students do not miss out on key concepts when they are absent for

extended periods. I understand that sometimes there are extenuating circumstances that require time to be taken outside of the normal vacation period (eg funeral overseas/interstate). If this is the case, permission must be sought in writing and directed to the Principal for approval. The Department of Education encourages Principals to use the code 'Unauthorised Vacation' when families take vacation during term time.

Seren Marshall (TA5) donated her beautiful long hair last week on Thursday 16th May for charity. Seren has never had her hair cut since she was born, and as she got older she decided she wanted to grow her hair like Rapunzel. Recently, Seren decided that she wanted to help children who have lost their hair due to Cancer or Alopecia. She wanted to help put the smiles back on their faces again by donating her hair for a wig. Her friend in class, Cerys O'Connell, also did the same a few months back and Seren was inspired. After having her hair cut into a short bob, she donated 10 inches of her hair which will help tremendously with making a wig for someone. Seren received a certificate that she can treasure and keep as a reminder of what she did for years to come. Seren is happy with her new look and we all agree she looks gorgeous! # **NAPLAN**

By the time this newsletter is sent out, most of the NAPLAN tests will have been completed. NAPLAN is a nation-wide assessment which gives us an opportunity to not only track the progress of our students, but also gives us a chance to look at detailed results within our own school. This is a very valuable process which helps us make decisions at a whole school level, and assess the outcome of the teaching and learning programs we use. NAPLAN is one test at one point in time and at Kinross, our staff adopt a wide variety of assessments at this school, which when combined, give an overall snapshot of a child's ability.

I would like to acknowledge our Year 3 and 5 students who, over the last two weeks, have sat these assessments with confidence and were willing to give it their best shot. Thank you also to their teachers for administering the assessment, and a special thank you to Mr Hood and Mr Carlisle for offering their technical support during this time.


# Uniform Shop – a message from Margaret
